



COLORADO BASKETBALL CLUB CODE OF CONDUCT

- **Athletes are not to give out any personal information to any person not affiliated with the Colorado Basketball Club.**
- Athletes are expected to maintain the high expectations of attitude and proper personal conduct during team travel and while wearing the CBC uniform. They must remember they are representing the Colorado Basketball Club at all times.
- Athletes must avoid incidents which could be interpreted as bringing discredit to the CBC program. Should there be a circumstance beyond the athlete's control, she must immediately report the incident to the coach.
- Athletes will be prompt and attend all authorized events.
- Athletes will be expected follow the dress code for travel tournaments as stated in the travel packet on the travel sheet. No short shorts allowed.
- For national travel events, athletes are to inform a coach of her location at all times, and must always be accompanied with two "buddies" or parents.
- All Athletes must stay at the hotel or sport complex unless previous permission is granted.
- Players are not allowed to leave their hotel room once a room check has occurred.
 - The door is to remain locked. No one is to enter the room after room check. If this rule is violated, the player will sit out 1 game as a 1st offense consequence. If it happens a 2nd time throughout the season, the player will be sent home.
 - Once room check has occurred, all cell phones must be put away. NO TEXTING or SOCIAL MEDIA ACTIVITY.
- Athletes are responsible for all personal property and money. Therefore, athletes should be cautious of what is left where – neatness and organization are a must.
- Should cell phones and texting become an 'issue' during the trip, coach's may ask to keep them for a while. You are on the trip to play basketball.
- There will be no Alcohol, Tobacco, or Drugs tolerated. Use or possession at any Colorado Basketball Club events, trips or activities will cause dismissal for the athlete.
- There will be no sexual interactions at any time during the trip. This refers to opposite or same sex. Violation will result in the player being sent home.
- Athletes are responsible for any and all damages they cause.
- It is important for teammates to communicate clearly and respect each other. Should a conflict amongst player occur, coaches will facilitate mediation should it become necessary. However, Athletes are expected to resolve differences among themselves if at all possible.
- Failure to comply with any and all rules maybe cause for loss of participation time or dismissal from event. Should this be the case, parent/guardian must pick up athlete from destination location immediately upon notification.
- Parent/guardian is responsible for costs incurred while retrieving the athlete if rules are violated.
